Subject: Important roadworks information: A47 Blundeston Roundabout to Bascule Bridge – remaining works

Dear Customer

We wrote to you in September 2024 to inform you of our works to resurface and renew the road markings on the A47 in Lowestoft. While we successfully completed most of this by the end of 2024, some works were delayed due to poor weather conditions.

We now need to return to complete the outstanding work, consisting of upgrading signs, replacing damaged ironwork, and refreshing road markings.

We plan to complete this work over **eight nights** between **Monday 24 February** and **Thursday 6 March 2025**. We will work between **8pm** and **6am only**, weather permitting.

Closures and diversions

To carry out the work safely, we will need to close the A47 and divert traffic as detailed below:

Yarmouth Road	Tuesday 25 to Wednesday 26 February	There will be lane closures, operated by 2-way traffic signals.
